Jean- Baptiste Le Moyne, Sieur de Bienville	1699	French (younger brother of Iberville)	To locate the Mississippi River and establish a French colony	Along with brother, explored Mississippi River and Gulf Coast	Built Fort Maurepas on Biloxi Bay
