

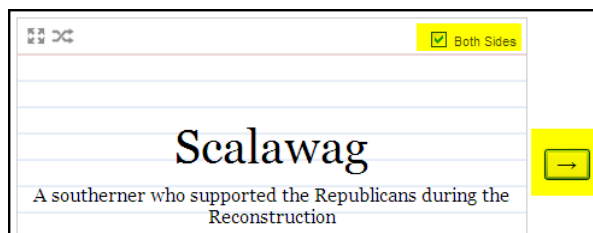

If there is time at the end of this activity, you may try taking a “test” or playing the games: Scatter and/or Space Race.

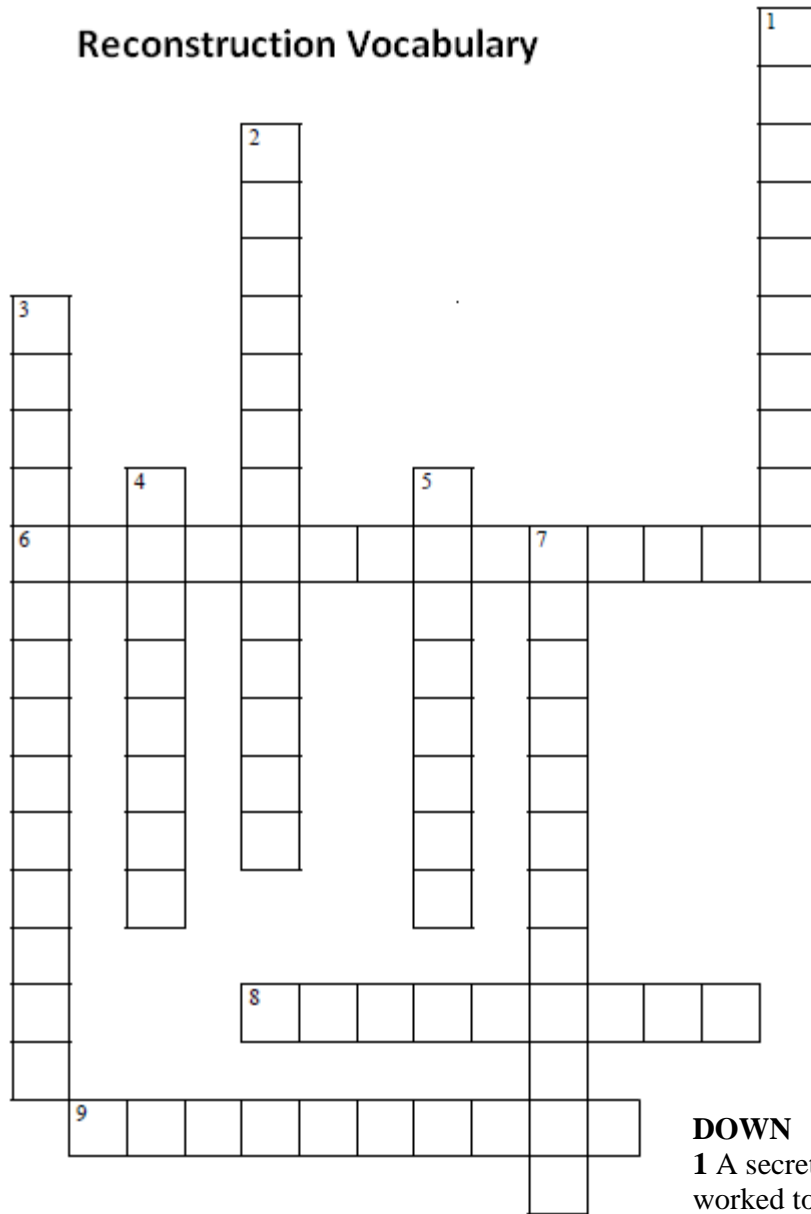

- 1** A secret racist organization, formed in 1865, that worked to keep the freedmen from voting after the Civil War
- 2** An amendment to the US Constitution, ratified in 1865, that made slavery illegal
- 3** Unfair treatment of one person/group because of prejudice

- 5** A former slave
