 Missouri has Civil War history that is celebrated (Bushwhacker Days).

 Good harvests are celebrated with festivals such as the Pumpkinfest, Black Walnut Festival, and Corn Fest.

- The National Register of Historic Places lists buildings that are famous for their history (Lafayette County Courthouse) or architecture (Adair County Courthouse).

 The Howard School is an example of an historic building because it was a school for freed slaves.
- Churches and homes can be historic places, too.
- A town such as <u>Grandin</u> is historic because of its unusual history.
- Fort Davidson and Wilson's Creek are historic because of the part they played in the Civil War
